AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF THE BOROUGH OF CHAMBERSBURG CHAPTER 286 VEHICLES AND TRAFFIC IN ORDER TO REVISE RULES ASSOCIATED WITH OFF-STREET PARKING LOTS, ARTICLE V, UNMETERED OFF STREET PARKING, AND ARTICLE VI, METERED OFF STREET PARKING

WHEREAS, the Borough Code (8 Pa.C.S.A. §§ 101-3501) in section 1202(31) authorizes a borough to regulate the use of parking lots and regulate parking; and

WHEREAS, having been recommended by the Borough of Chambersburg Parking Traffic, and Street Lights Advisory Committee, the Council of the Borough of Chambersburg deems it to be in the best interest and general welfare of the citizens and residents of the Borough to amend certain sections of Chapter 286 of the Code of the Borough of Chambersburg as set forth herein.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Mayor and Borough Council of the Borough of Chambersburg, Franklin County, Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION 1. The contents of CHAPTER 286, Article V, of the Code of the Borough of Chambersburg, entitled "Unmetered Off-Street Parking", are hereby deleted in their entirety and replaced with the following:

Article V, Unmetered Off-Street Parking

§ 286-52 Municipal lots herein established for certain vehicles only.

- A. There shall be, within the Borough of Chambersburg, certain locations, herein established as municipal off-street parking lots, such lots not having parking meters, not within the public right-of-way, but municipal property, established for the temporary storage of motor vehicles, under rules herein established, without parking meters, in the following locations:

Borough Hall Lot – Ludwig Avenue and Harrison Avenue
Central Lot – Burkhart Avenue and Central Avenue
Chambers Centre Lot – Ludwig Avenue and Central Avenue
Dice Lot – Ludwig Avenue and Central Avenue
Hemlock Circle Lot – Hemlock Circle
Hood Street Lot – Hood Street
Loudon Lot (CVS) – Loudon Street and Queen Street
McKinley Street Firehouse Lot – Harrison Avenue and Pine Court
Memorial Park Lots – Memorial Park
Mill Creek Acres Lot – Hollywell Avenue and Eisenhower Drive
Mowery Drive Lot – Mowery Drive and North Second Street
Pine Woods Park Lot – Dump Road
Rail Trail Lots – Rail Trail
Recreation Center Lot – South Third Street
Rosedale & Spring Street Lot – Spring Street and Montgomery Avenue
Shoppers' Lot – Black Avenue between Lincoln Way and Queen Street
South Street Lot – South Street between Central Avenue and South Second

- B. Said Parking Lots may also be equipped with parking meters in some spaces pursuant to Article VI.
- C. In such lots and in such parking spaces without parking meters, the Borough of Chambersburg may, from time to time, establish a parking permit system, for the use of unmetered parking lots in exchange for a usage fee, to be established by Borough Council, from time to time. Parking permits sold for municipal parking lots shall be valid and in effect between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, provided that the requirements of this article as to parking permits shall not apply on legal holidays as defined in this chapter as well as Saturdays and Sundays. These parking permits shall be established as such:
- (1) The permits shall be of the types and form determined by the Borough Treasurer and shall be displayed by hanging from the rearview mirror. If mirror design prohibits the hanging of the permit, the permit shall be displayed on the left side of the dashboard of the motor vehicle authorized to use the same so that the permit is clearly visible through the windshield.
 - (2) It shall be a violation of this section for any person to use or display a permit, or to make available or permit its use or display in or on, a vehicle not authorized or entitled hereunder to use, or by an operator not authorized to use such permit, or to display, the same.
 - (3) Types of Permits.
 - a. Permits assigned to vehicle, spots are on a first-come-first-serve basis: In some parking lots, at the discretion of the Borough Manager, the system shall be that permits are issued to vehicle(s) for their use for a set period of time. In such vehicle specific permit parking lots, a group of parking spaces shall be designated for those vehicle permits on a first-come-first-serve basis between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, provided that the requirements of this article as to parking permits shall not apply on legal holidays as defined in this chapter as well as Saturdays and Sundays.
 - b. Permits assigned to specific parking spot: In some parking lots, at the discretion of the Borough Manager, the system shall be that permits are parking space specific. In such circumstances, in all parking lots, other than the Rosedale Parking Lot, such designated spaces shall be available for specific permits between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, provided that the requirements of this article as to parking permits shall not apply on legal holidays as defined in this chapter as well as Saturdays and Sundays. However, in the Rosedale Parking Lot, the Borough Manager is authorized herein to direct the issuance of a limited number of 24/7/365 space specific parking permits, for an additional fee, to be set by Council, from time to time.
 - (4) Application for Permits. The application for a parking permit shall contain at least the following information:
 - a. The name, address, and telephone number of the applicant for which a permit is sought and, if the person is not a Borough resident, their business name, address, and telephone number;
 - b. A current valid driver's license number of the person in possession of the permit as taken from that person's current driver's license;

c. In those cases where parking permits are vehicle specific, the applicant shall provide owners information about the permitted vehicle, the name of the owner, the owner's address and phone number, and a copy of the vehicle registration and/or license plate number.

- (5) The Borough Treasurer shall establish the type and form of application for permits.
- (6) The Borough Treasurer may require satisfactory proof of all information set forth on any application and any other information deemed necessary by the Borough Treasurer.
- (7) Permits may be sold on a monthly, quarterly, semi-annual, or annual basis.
- (8) In some cases, the permit may provide the reservation of particular parking spaces. In other cases, said permit may provide access to the next available space in a group of space so designated for this purpose. The Borough Manager is herein authorized to designate which spaces shall be associated with which system.
- (9) Upon receipt of the application and permit fee and determination that the information upon the application indicates that the applicant is entitled to the requested permit, the Borough Treasurer shall issue the same, which shall be valid until the last day of the period for which the permit was sold. The permit shall be renewable at any time prior to its expiration date for a period beginning on the day following its expiration date, so long as the Borough Treasurer is satisfied that there have been no changes in the information set forth on the application.
- (10) It shall be a violation of this section for any person to submit incorrect information on an application for a permit or in seeking a renewal thereof.
- (11) Change of license or address. If a person to whom a parking permit is currently issued for their home or work address for which that permit has been issued, such person shall update their information to the Borough Treasurer. If such person renews or replaces their driver's license during the then-current period of such permit, the Borough Treasurer shall, on application therefor, update said permit information accordingly.
- (12) Disposal of motor vehicle. If a person to whom a vehicle specific parking permit is currently issued sells or otherwise disposes of the motor vehicle for which that permit has been issued, such person shall remove the decal permit and return it to the Borough Treasurer. If such person replaces that vehicle with another during the then-current period of such permit, the Borough Treasurer shall, on application therefor, issue a replacement permit of the same type for that motor vehicle for the balance of the period without another application fee being paid.
- (13) Forfeiture of permit. In addition to the other penalties provided in this chapter, the Borough Treasurer may declare a parking permit to be forfeited for any violation of this section by the holder thereof and require the permit to be delivered to the Finance Department.

D. No vehicle over twenty one (21) feet in length may park in any municipal parking lot. No vehicle registered as a mobile home or camper may park in any municipal parking lot. No trailer or hitch may be parked in any municipal parking lot unless it is connected to a motor vehicle and the sum of the length of the motor vehicle and trailer or hitch is twenty one (21) feet or less. No unregistered or uninsured vehicle may be parked in a municipal parking lot. No vehicle creating or being a nuisance in fact may be parked in a municipal parking lot.

§ 286-53 Municipal lot for public use except certain marked areas.

Municipal parking lots shall be for the use of the public, except for those areas marked as being for the use of Borough employees, school employees, or police, during the days and times indicated.

§ 286-54 Manner of parking in municipal parking lots.

All vehicles parked in a municipal parking lot, hereinabove referred to, shall be parked wholly within the lines bounding or marking an individual parking space, hereinafter known as a stall; and, it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle elsewhere than in such a stall. It is a violation of this Article to park in prohibited areas including but not limited to access and exit driveways and turning areas.

§ 286-55 Overnight parking permitted under certain conditions.

Overnight parking shall be permitted in a municipal parking lot, without a permit, listed § 286-52, provided that the Borough Manager, or his designee, may from time to time, ban overnight parking in those lots, or in such parts of those lots, which may be closed off for the purposes of cleaning, snow removal, special events, or similar purposes. In such cases, it shall be unlawful to remove, relocate, or ignore officials' barricades established for such temporary closure of these parking lots.

§ 286-56 Municipal parking lots at recreation facilities and the Rail-Trail.

Municipal parking lots in or at recreation facilities including Memorial Park, Mill Creek Acres Park, Pine Woods Park, the Cumberland Valley Rail Trail, including the Hood Street Lot, and others, are generally for the proper use of those facilities. Therefore, parking is provided from dawn to dusk, and no overnight parking is permitted in such locations, unless so indicated by the Chambersburg Recreation Department.

§ 286-57 Eugene C. Clarke Municipal Recreation Center Parking Lot.

The municipal parking lot at the Eugene C. Clarke Recreation Center shall be reserved for programs and events at the Recreation Center facility unless so indicated by the Chambersburg Recreation Department.

§ 286-58 Violations and penalties.

Penalties for violation of Article V.

- A. Tickets may be left on the windshield of the vehicle in the form established by the Borough or delivered by regular mail to the owner of such vehicle in violation. Failure to receive ticket after being conspicuously posted, is no excuse for invalidation of penalty. Operators who fail to accept a parking ticket by leaving the scene before the issuer has an opportunity to conspicuously post said ticket, will receive the ticket by United States first-class mail.
- B. Ticket amounts are due upon their issuance and may be paid, in person, at the Borough office during regular business hours.
- C. Any person and/or entity violating any provision of Article V shall, upon conviction thereof, be guilty of a summary offense and sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$50 plus court costs and reasonable attorney fees and, in the event of default of payment, such violator may be sentenced

to imprisonment for a period not to exceed five days. Each day and/or each violation by the same person and/or entity shall be considered a new and separate violation of the Code of the Borough of Chambersburg.

- D. Borough police officers and parking enforcement officers as defined herein are hereby duly authorized to issue a ticket in the form established by the Borough to any person and/or entity violating the provisions of Article V. The ticket shall instruct such violator that if the offender reports to the Borough office and pays the Borough the sum of \$25 within 6 days of the date of issuance of the ticket, then such payment shall save the violator through prosecution by a citation, which prosecution may result in court costs and attorney fees being assessed against the violator in addition to the fine.
- E. Notwithstanding the above, any police officer or parking enforcement officer shall have the sole and absolute discretion to issue a citation without first issuing a ticket as provided for herein.

SECTION 2. The contents of CHAPTER 286, Article VI, of the Code of the Borough of Chambersburg, entitled “Metered Off-Street Parking”, are hereby deleted in their entirety and replaced with the following:

Article VI, Metered Off-Street Parking

§ 286-59 Municipal lots herein established for certain vehicles only.

- A. There shall be, within the Borough of Chambersburg, certain locations, herein established as municipal off-street parking lots, such lots having parking meters, not within the public right-of-way, but municipal property, established for the temporary storage of motor vehicles, under rules herein established, with parking meters, in the following locations:

- Capital Lot – South Main Street
- Chambers Centre Lot – Ludwig Avenue and Central Avenue
- Dice Lot – Ludwig Avenue and Central Avenue
- East Point Lot – Queen Street and Lincoln Way
- Fifth Avenue Lot – Fifth Avenue between Queen Street and Lincoln Way
- Harrison Avenue Lot – Harrison Avenue between Burkhart and Washington Street
- Kirson Lot – Central Avenue between Burkhart Avenue and Queen Street
- Rosedale & Spring Street Lot – Spring Street and Montgomery Avenue
- Shoppers’ Lot – Black Avenue between Lincoln Way and Queen Street
- Valley Bank Lot – Black Avenue and Queen Street

- B. Said Parking Lots may also be equipped with parking spaces without parking meters pursuant to Article V.

§ 286-60 Parking time limits and charges.

- A. Each parking meter in said lots shall be in operation and the provisions of this chapter regulating such operation and establishing parking time limits shall be in force between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday (not applicable to Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays). Upon the deposit of such coin or coins and placing the meter in operation, such parking space may be lawfully occupied upon payment of a fee, which may be set from time to time by resolution of Town Council.

- B. Rosedale & Spring Street Lot. The multi-space parking meter kiosk system in use in the Rosedale & Spring Street Parking Lot shall be in operation and the provisions of this chapter regulating such operation and establishing parking time limits shall be in force between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Mondays through Fridays (not applicable to Saturdays, Sundays, and legal holidays). Upon the deposit of such coin or coins and placing the meter in operation, such parking space may be lawfully occupied upon payment of a fee, which may be set from time to time by resolution of Town Council.
- C. Parking at parking meters shall require no deposit of coins other than between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, provided that the requirements of this article as to metered parking shall not apply on legal holidays as defined in this chapter as well as Saturdays and Sundays.
- D. Users may re-deposit coins into a parking meter in order to extend the period of eligibility to park in such spaces during those periods when the deposit of coins is required (hereinafter known as “feed the meter”).

§ 286-61 Placement and characteristics of meters and parking spaces.

- A. Parking meters installed on said lots shall be placed immediately adjacent to the individual parking spaces, unless meters are multi-space parking meter kiosks, and said meters shall be designated by an identification sign. Each parking meter shall be placed or set in such manner as to show the parking space adjacent to such meter is or is not legally occupied, except in such cases as a multi-space parking meter kiosk system. Each parking meter installed shall indicate by a proper legend the legal time established by this article and, when occupied, shall indicate on and by its dial and pointer or digital display the duration of the period of legal parking and, on the expiration of such period, shall indicate illegal or overtime parking.
- B. All vehicles parked in a municipal parking lot, hereinabove referred to, shall be parked wholly within the lines bounding or marking an individual parking space, hereinafter known as a stall; and, it shall be unlawful to park any vehicle elsewhere than in such a stall. It is a violation of this Article to park in prohibited areas including but not limited to access and exit driveways and turning areas.
- C. No vehicle over twenty one (21) feet in length may park in any municipal parking lot. No vehicle registered as a mobile home or camper may park in any municipal parking lot. No trailer or hitch may be parked in any municipal parking lot unless it is connected to a motor vehicle, and, the sum of the length of the motor vehicle and trailer or hitch is twenty one (21) feet or less. No unregistered or uninsured vehicle may be parked in a municipal parking lot. No vehicle creating or being a nuisance in fact may be parked in a municipal parking lot.

§ 286-62 Multi-space parking meter kiosk system.

- A. The Borough of Chambersburg operates the following type of multispace parking meter system: The multispace parking meter system displays the date, time and amount of time remaining or length of time expired (up to 72 hours) on an attached computer screen. The user identifies the number of the parking space vehicle operator intends to use (park in), presses the corresponding number on the machine keypad, and places coin in the machine until vehicle operator has

achieved the desired time. Expiration time for each space is stored in the master meter computer and displayed, on demand, on the machine screen for all spaces governed by that machine.

- B. Whenever a multispace parking meter system is in use, the operator of any vehicle, upon entering a parking space during the time of limited parking, shall immediately deposit the proper coin in the multispace parking meter governing the parking space, dependent upon the length of time vehicle operator desires to park such vehicle. Failure to deposit legal tender shall be a violation of this article and shall be subject to a fine in accordance with § 286-68, Violations and penalties.
- C. The multispace parking meter system shall be used in the following places:

Rosedale & Spring Street Lot, defined as "the lot bounded on the east by North Main Street, on the south by Lincoln Way West and on the north and the west by Spring Street."

§ 286-63 Coin deposit in meter; overtime parking unlawful.

Whenever a vehicle is to be parked in any of said parking lots at any time during which the parking meters therein shall be in operation, the operator of such vehicle shall, upon entering a parking space adjacent to a parking meter, immediately deposit, or cause to be deposited, in such parking meter, one or more coins of the United States, as so designated by the Borough Treasurer, as shall be specified in the legend upon such parking meter. Upon the deposit of such coin or coins and placing the meter in operation, such parking space may be lawfully occupied by such vehicle for the length of time designated by § 286-60 of this article for parking in said parking lot upon deposit of such coin or coins. If any vehicle shall remain in any such parking space for such length of time that the meter shall indicate by a proper signal that the lawful parking time shall have expired, such vehicle shall be considered as having been parked overtime, and the parking of a vehicle overtime shall be a violation of this article, provided that every hour that a vehicle shall remain parked at a meter showing a violation shall constitute a separate violation of this article.

§ 286-64 Unlawful to tamper with parking meter.

It shall be unlawful, and a violation of this article, for any person to deface, tamper with, open or willfully break, destroy or impair the usefulness of any parking meter installed under the provisions of this article, provided that nothing herein shall apply to the servicing or opening of parking meters by officers, employees and/or parking enforcement officers of the Borough under the direction of the Mayor and/or the Borough Council.

§ 286-65 Municipal lot for public use except certain marked areas.

Municipal parking lots shall be for the use of the public, except for those areas marked as being for the use of Borough employees, school employees, or police, during the days and times indicated.

§ 286-66 Overnight parking permitted under certain conditions.

Overnight parking shall be permitted in a municipal parking lot, without coin deposit in meter, listed in § 286-52, provided that the Borough Manager, or his designee, may from time to time, ban overnight parking in those lots, or in such parts of those lots, which may be closed off for the purposes of cleaning,

snow removal, special events, or similar purposes. In such cases, it shall be unlawful to remove, relocate, or ignore officials' barricades established for such temporary closure of these parking lots.

§ 286-67 Parking enforcement officers.

The Borough of Chambersburg may establish the position of parking enforcement officer, a local code enforcement official, for the sole purpose of the enforcement of laws associated with parking.

- A. It shall be the duty of the parking enforcement officers of the Borough to report:
 - (1) The number of each parking meter that indicates that the vehicle occupying the parking space adjacent thereto is or has been parking in violation of any of the provisions of this article;
 - (2) The hour and date of such violation;
 - (3) The state license number of such vehicle; and
 - (4) Any other facts, the knowledge of which shall be necessary for an understanding of the circumstances attending such violation.

- B. Any such police officer, or parking enforcement officer, who shall undertake enforcement of these provisions, shall also place upon such vehicle a ticket to the owner or operator thereof that such vehicle was parked in violation of the provisions of this article; and further said notice shall instruct such owner or operator that if they shall report to the office of the Chief of Police, or his designee, and pay, for the collection by the Borough, the fine indicated below, or if they shall place the fine indicated below enclosed within the envelope provided in the night deposit box installed at Borough Hall, within such time limits as herein established, the same shall save such violator from prosecution and from further payment of the fines and costs hereinafter provided in § 286-68 of this article.

§ 286-68 Violations and penalties.

Penalties for violation of Article VI.

- A. Tickets may be left on the windshield of the vehicle in the form established by the Borough or delivered by regular mail to the owner of such vehicle in violation. Failure to receive ticket after being conspicuously posted, is no excuse for invalidation of penalty. Operators who fail to accept a parking ticket by leaving the scene before the issuer has an opportunity to conspicuously post said ticket, will receive the ticket by United States first-class mail.
- B. Ticket amounts are due upon their issuance and may be paid, in person, at the Borough office during regular business hours.
- C. Any person and/or entity violating any provision of Article VI shall, upon conviction thereof, be guilty of a summary offense and sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$50 plus court costs and reasonable attorney fees and, in the event of default of payment, such violator may be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not to exceed five days. Each day and/or each violation by the same person and/or entity shall be considered a new and separate violation of the Code of the Borough of Chambersburg.
- D. Penalties for violation of metered parking stalls for handicapped persons' or disabled veteran's provisions.
 - (1) Any person and/or entity violating any provisions and/or rules for metered parking stalls for handicapped persons' or disabled veteran's shall, upon conviction thereof, be guilty of a summary offense and sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$200 plus court costs and reasonable attorney fees and, in the event of default of payment, such violator may be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not to exceed five days. Each day and/or each violation by the same person and/or entity shall be considered a new and separate violation of the Code of the Borough of Chambersburg.
 - (2) Borough police officers and parking enforcement officers as defined herein are hereby duly authorized to issue a ticket in the form established by the Borough to any person and/or entity violating any provisions and/or rules for metered parking stalls for handicapped persons' or disabled veteran's. The ticket shall instruct such violator that if violator reports to the Borough office and pays the Borough the sum of \$50 within 6 days of the date of issuance of the ticket, then such payment shall save the violator through prosecution by a citation, which prosecution may result in court costs and attorney fees being assessed against the violator in addition to the fine.
 - (3) Notwithstanding the above, any police officer or parking enforcement officer shall have the sole and absolute discretion to issue a citation without first issuing a ticket as provided for herein.
- E. Penalties for violation of Article VI; exceptions.
 - (1) Any person and/or entity violating any of the provisions of this Article VI, Metered Off-Street Parking, except § 286-64 and/or as set forth in Subsections C and D above, shall, upon conviction thereof, be guilty of a summary offense and sentenced to pay a fine of not more than \$40 plus court costs and reasonable attorney fees and, in the

event of default of payment, such violator may be sentenced to imprisonment for a period not to exceed five days. Each day and/or each violation by the same person and/or entity shall be considered a new and separate violation of the Code of the Borough of Chambersburg.

- (2) Borough police officers and or parking enforcement officers as defined herein are duly authorized to issue a ticket in the form established by the Borough to any person and/or entity violating any provisions of this Article VI, Metered Off-Street Parking, except § 286-64 and/or as set forth in Subsections C and D above. The ticket shall instruct such violator that if violator reports to the Borough office and pays the Borough the sum of \$5 within 72 hours of the date of issuance of the ticket, then such payment shall save the violator through prosecution by a citation, which prosecution may result in court costs and attorney fees being assessed against the violator in addition to the fine.
- (3) The ticket set forth in this subsection shall also instruct such violator that if violator reports to the Borough office and pays the Borough the sum of \$20 after 72 hours but within not more than six days of the date of issuance of the ticket, then such payment shall save the violator through prosecution by a citation, which prosecution may result in court costs and attorney fees being assessed against the violator in addition to the fine.
- (4) Notwithstanding the above, any police officer or parking enforcement officer shall have the sole and absolute discretion to issue a citation without first issuing a ticket as provided for herein.

§ 286-69 Suspension of regulations.

The Borough Manager, or his designee, is hereby authorized to suspend, in whole or in part, the parking meter regulations set forth in this article, during such days or such hours, as may be deemed necessary by the Borough Manager or his designee.

§ 286-70 ~~Parking meters restricted in certain parking lots.~~ RESERVED

~~The following restrictions shall apply for the parking lots enumerated in this section:
Ludwig Avenue Lot — Parking prohibited between 11:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.~~

§ 286-71 Parking meters restricted to handicap placard access only.

The following restrictions shall apply for the parking meters enumerated in this section:

- A. In the East Point Parking Lot, the first two-hour metered parking space in the southeast corner shall be designated as authorized for parking of a handicapped person's or disabled veteran's vehicle only. Such vehicles shall bear a special handicapped registration plate or display a placard issued by the commonwealth, or any other state, evidencing a handicapped person's or disabled veteran's vehicle.

- B. In the Rosedale & Sprint Street Parking Lot, the first two perpendicular parking spaces inside the lot entrance off North Main Street and the last perpendicular parking space at the westernmost end of the lot closest to Spring Street shall be designated as authorized for parking of a handicapped persons' or disabled veteran's vehicle only. Such vehicles must bear a special handicapped registration plate or display a placard issued by the commonwealth, or any other state, evidencing a handicapped persons' or disabled veteran's vehicle.

SECTION 3. The provisions of this Ordinance are severable and if any of its sections, clauses or sentences shall be held illegal, invalid or unconstitutional, such provision shall not affect or impair any other sections, clauses or sentences of the same.

SECTION 4. Repealer. All provisions of previous ordinances of the Borough of Chambersburg, which are contrary to this Ordinance, are expressly repealed.

SECTION 5. Effective date. The provisions of this ordinance shall take effective immediately.
